(CAPVA)















Background



- CAPVA has no single definition, it can involve any act of violence, abuse, coercion, or criminal damage in the home (or other environment) by a child/adolescent towards a parent, often following a continued pattern of multiple behaviours.
- ·However, globally there are many inconsistencies in the definitions of CAPVA which can be attributed to the way it is perceived, operationalised and measured, and results in little support available for those families experiencing it.
- CAPVA is becoming more widely recognised in the UK and internationally as a serious, emerging public health issue, with immense impacts on children/adolescents, parents, family members and the wider community.

Policy Review

- ▶ In light of the recent Home Office consultation to define CAPVA and better respond to it, this policy review was carried out to explore
 - How CAPVA is defined through policy, legislation and guidance for practitioners
 - What approaches to preventing and responding to CAPVA are recommended in policy, legislation and guidance
 - How and by whom are CAPVA policy, legislation and guidance developed, and what evidence, theoretical framework or legislation underpins them



Policy Review Findings

- Data was extracted from 18 documents
- ▶ 61% were guidance documents rather than official policy
- 61% were produced by a charity, support service or independent (such as an academic)
- 94% were targeted at practitioners
- Only 17% were targeted at police and criminal justice
