

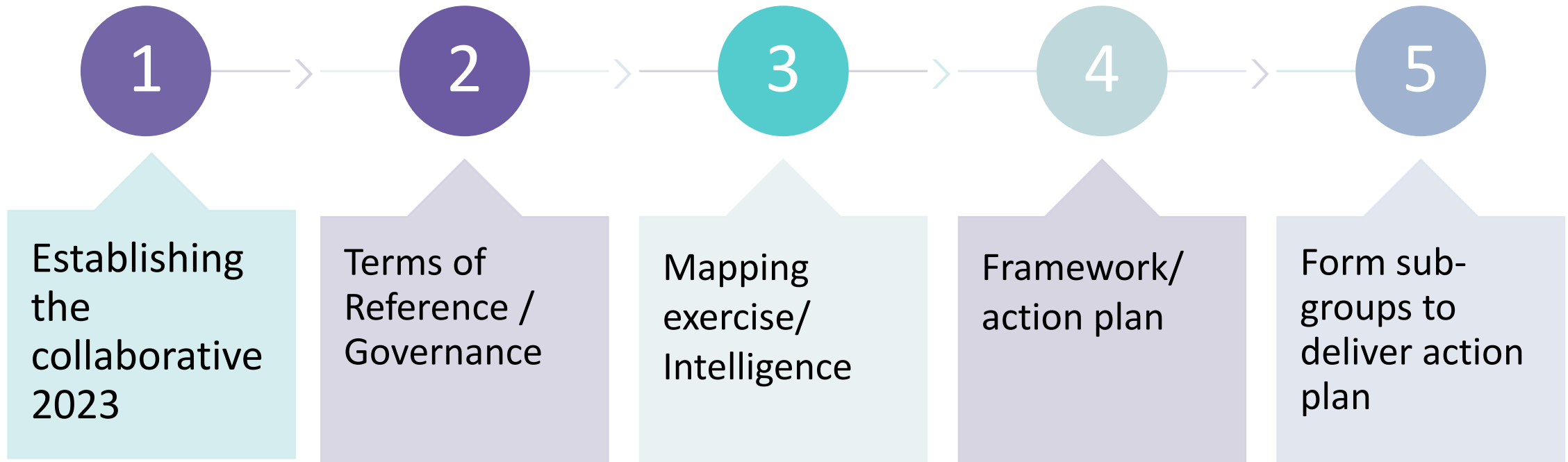

Aim:

Intelligence

By 2040, the population aged 75+ years is expected to increase by 44% to 364,832 people. The overall population is only modelled to increase by 7%.

For 8/9 places hospital admissions due to falls is significantly worse than England for 3 indicators (age 65+, age 65-79, age 80+)

Some highest rates for falls – 5 places within top 20 in England (Knowsley 4th highest)

Mapping results

- Wide disparities between commissioned services as well as third sector provision
- Disparities in:
 - Availability of home assessments
 - Use of technology
 - Strength and Balance
- Falls pathways not clear
- Fracture Liaison Service not available across C&M
