



Injury attendances to Rochdale Infirmary Emergency Department

April 2013 to March 2014

This report summarises recorded injury attendances to Rochdale Infirmary Emergency Department (ED) between April 2013 and March 2014.

Between April 2013 and March 2014 there were 21,427 injury attendances to Rochdale Infirmary ED. Males accounted for over half (53%) of all injury attendances. The month with the highest injury attendances was July (n=2,129) with November having the lowest attendances (n=1,509) (Figure 1). The majority (70%) of attendances were recorded as other injury. Of the specified injury groups, falls accounted for the highest proportion (16%) followed by road traffic collision (RTC) (5%) (Table 1).




Figure 3: Rochdale Infirmary ED: Total injury attendances by age group and injury group (excluding other injury), April 2013 to March 2014

For all injuries the highest proportion of attendances were for persons aged 5-19 years (28%) and 20-34 (23%) (Figure 2). Over a quarter (28%) of fall attendees was aged 65 or over. Close to four in ten (37%) of assault attendees were aged 20-34. Almost four in ten (39%) of RTC attendees were aged 20-34 (Figure 3).

Table 2 shows the ethnicity of injury attendees to Rochdale Infirmary ED. The large majority (73%) were white.

The disposal of a patient can give an indication of the severity of the injuries sustained. The majority (67%) of attendees were discharged, over three in ten (31%) were referred and 2% were admitted (Table 3).

Table 4 shows the arrival methods of attendances at Rochdale Infirmary ED. Three quarters (75%) of attendees arrived by public transport and 4% arrived by ambulance.

Table 5 shows the incident location of injury attendances to Rochdale Infirmary ED. Over half (51%) occurred at home, while over one in five (22%) of injury attendances were recorded as other, and 11% in a public place.

Table 6 presents the method of disposal for each patient type. The majority (64%) of assault patients were discharged without requiring further treatment. One third (33%) of fall attendances were referred and 19% of DSH (deliberate self-harm) patients were admitted.

Table 7 shows data relating to the location of incident for assault attendees to Rochdale Infirmary ED. The majority of attendees were male (69%) and two fifths of all assaults (40%) occurred in a public place.

Figure 1: Rochdale Infirmary ED: Total injury attendances by gender and month, April 2013 to March 2014



Figure 2: Rochdale Infirmary ED: Total injury attendances by age group and month, April 2013 to March 2014


