

Injury attendances to Rochdale Infirmary Emergency Department

April 2009 to March 2010

This report summarises recorded injury attendances to Rochdale Infirmary Emergency Department (ED) between April 2009 and March 2010.

Between April 2009 and March 2010, there were 26,328 injury attendances to Rochdale Infirmary ED. Males accounted for just over half of all attendances (n=14,440; 55%). The month with the highest attendances was March (n=2,629) with April having the lowest attendances (n=1,793) (Figure 1). The majority of attendances were recorded as other injury (58%); of the specified injury groups falls accounted for the highest proportion (23%) followed by road traffic collision (RTC) (7%) and assault (6%) (Table 1).

For all attendances the highest proportion were for persons aged 5 to 19 (25%) and 20 to 34 (24%) (Figure 2). Over a third (34%) of fall attendees were aged 65 or over. Over two-fifths (45%) of assault attendees were aged 20 to 34. Two-fifths (40%) of RTC attendees were aged 20 to 34 (Figure 3).

Table 2 shows the location where injuries occurred. Nearly two-fifths (40%) of injuries occurred in the home; 15% of injuries occurred in a public place with a smaller proportion occurring at work (5%) and at school (5%). Over two-fifths (41%) of falls occurred in the home whilst nearly two-thirds (65%) of DSH injuries occurred in the home. Nearly half (46%) of assaults occurred in a public place.

Table 3 shows the ethnicity of attendees to Rochdale Infirmary ED. Three-quarters (n=19,787; 75%) were white and 16% were Pakistani.

The disposal of a patient can give an indication of the severity of the injuries sustained. Nearly six in ten (59%) of attendees were discharged, over three in ten (31%) were referred and 8% were admitted (Table 4). Nearly three-quarters (72%) of RTC attendees were discharged. Over half (57%) of burn/scald attendees were referred (Table 5).

Table 6 shows the arrival methods of attendances at Rochdale Infirmary ED. Over six in ten (64%) arrived by private transport whilst 15% arrived by ambulance.

Figure 4 (a-d) shows crude rates of injury attendance at Rochdale Infirmary ED by area of residence, in this case Middle Super Output Area (MSOA). The MSOAs with the highest crude rates are indicated beneath each figure. ¹

Figure 1: Rochdale Infirmary ED: Total injury attendances by gender and month, April 2009 to March 2010




Figure 3: Rochdale Infirmary ED: Total injury attendances by age group and injury group, April 2009 to March 2010






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
c) RTC: quintiles of crude rates per 1,000 population


