

### January to December 2010

This report summarises recorded injury attendances to Royal Bolton Emergency Department (ED) between January and December 2010.




### Figure 1: Royal Bolton ED: Total injury attendances by gender and month, January to December 2010

Between January and December 2010 there were 49,009 attendances to Royal Bolton ED. Males accounted for over half (53%) of all attendances. The month with the highest attendances was May (n=4,773) with February having the lowest (n=3,519) (Figure 1). Of the specified injury groups, falls (8%) accounted for the highest proportion followed by road traffic collision (RTC) (3%) and assault (3%) (Table 1).

The highest proportion of attendances were for persons aged 20-34 (23%) and 5-19 years (20%) (Figure 2). Over four in ten (45%) of fall attendees were aged 65 or over while over three in ten (31%) of burns and scald injuries were sustained by 0 to 4 year olds. Nearly four in ten (38%) of RTC attendees were aged 20-34 (Figure 3).

Table 2 shows the ethnicity of attendees to RoyalBolton ED. Over two-thirds (70%) were white whilstover a fifth (22%) were recorded as not known.

The disposal of a patient can give an indication of the severity of the injuries sustained. Seven in ten (47%) of attendees were referred, nearly a third (32%) were discharged and 16% were admitted (Table 3). Nearly two-thirds (64%) of burns and scald attendees were

referred, while over a quarter (27%) of deliberate self-harm (DSH) attendees were admitted (Table 4).


**Table 5** shows the arrival methods of attendances at Royal Bolton ED. Nearly three-quarters (74%) of attendees arrived by foot, whilst over a quarter (26%) of attendees arrived by ambulance.

**Table 6** shows the time of arrival of attendees to Royal Bolton ED. The largest proportion of attendances occurred between 10.00am and 11.59am (n=6,507; 13%). **Table 7** shows the day of the week that attendees arrived at the hospital. Monday (17%) had the highest number of attendances.

**Table 8** presents data for assault attendees to Royal Bolton ED. Males represent over seven in ten (71%) of assault attendances, whilst over four in ten (44%) of assault attendees were aged 20 to 34. The peak days for attendance were weekends, between the hours of 8pm and 4am (34%).

**Figure 4 (a-d)** shows crude rates of attendance at Royal Bolton ED by attendee's area of residence, in this case Middle Super Output Area (MSOA). The MSOAs with the highest crude rates are indicated beneath each figure.<sup>1</sup>








a) All injury attendances: quintiles of crude rates per 1,000 population b) Fall: quintiles of crude rates per 1,000 population




c) Assault: quintiles of crude rates per 1,000 population Royal Bolton ED


