

Injury attendances to Royal Oldham Hospital Emergency Department

July 2010 to June 2011

This report summarises recorded injury attendances to Royal Oldham Hospital Emergency Department (ED) between July 2010 and June 2011.

Between July 2010 and June 2011 there were 31,450 injury attendances to Royal Oldham Hospital ED. Males accounted for over half (54%) of all attendances. The month with the highest attendances was May (n=3,088) with December (n=2,247) having the lowest attendances for injury (Figure 1). The majority (65%) of attendances were recorded as other injury. Of the specified injury groups fall (19%) accounted for the highest proportion followed by road traffic collisions (RTCs) (7%) (Table 1).

For all injuries the highest proportions of attendances were for persons aged 5 to 19 (27%) and 20 to 34 years (23%) (Figure 2). Nearly two-fifths (39%) of fall attendees were aged 65 or over (Figure 3).

Table 2 shows the location of the incident of injury attendances. Nearly a half (45%) of injuries occurred in the home. Three-quarters (75%) of deliberate self-harm (DSH) injuries and over a half (54%) of falls occurred in the home.

Table 3 shows the ethnicity of injury attendees to Royal Oldham Hospital ED. Three-quarters (75%) were white, 9% were Pakistani and 5% were Bangladeshi.

The disposal of a patient can give an indication of the severity of the injuries sustained. Nearly two-thirds (61%) of attendees were discharged, over a quarter (27%) had a referral/follow-up and 10% were admitted (Table 4). Over four in five (81%) of RTC attendees were discharged. Over one in ten (14%) of DSH attendees and over half (57%) of burns and scalds attendees had a referral/follow-up (Table 5).

Table 6 shows the arrival methods of injury attendances at Royal Oldham Hospital ED. Nearly seven in ten (69%) arrived by private transport while nearly one in five (19%) arrived by ambulance.

Table 7 presents data for assault attendances to Royal Oldham ED. Nearly three-quarters (74%) were male, over two-fifths (43%) occurred in a public place, nearly a half (47%) of attendees were aged 20 to 34, and over a third (34%) presented at the ED on weekend nights.

Figure 4 (a-d) shows crude rates of attendance at Royal Oldham Hospital ED by attendee's area of residence, in this case Middle Super Output Area (MSOA). The MSOAs with the highest crude rates are indicated beneath each figure.¹

¹ Population figures are drawn from mid-2008 population estimates from the Office for National Statistics.

Figure 1: Royal Oldham Hospital ED: Total injury attendances by gender and month, July 2010 to June 2011




Figure 3: Royal Oldham Hospital ED: Total injury attendances by age group and injury group (excluding other injury), July 2010 to June 2011







a) All attendances: quintiles of crude rates per 1,000 population



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


