

ALL INJURY ATTENDANCES




Figure 1: ED injury attendances by gender and month, October 2014 to September 2015^

This bulletin provides a breakdown of all injury attendances to Stepping Hill Hospital Emergency Department (ED) between October 2014 and September 2015. During this twelve month period there were 35,018 injury attendances to the ED. The month with the highest number of attendances, calculated as a daily average, was September 2015 (108 per day), while January 2015 had the fewest attendances (81 per day; figure 1). Males accounted for just over half (52%) of all attendances (figure 1).




Figure 2: ED injury attendances by age group and month, October 2014 to September 2015

The largest proportion of attendances was for those aged between 5 and 19 years (24%), while those aged between 20 and 34 years and aged 65 years and over accounted for 20% each (figure 2).

The majority (58%) of attendances did not have a specific injury group recorded. Of the specified injury groups, falls accounted for the highest proportion (19%), followed by sports injury (11%) and road traffic collisions (RTC, 6%; table 1).

Over half (53%) of fall attendees were aged 65 years or over, close to half (48%) of assault attendees were aged between 20 and 34 years and almost four in ten (36%) RTC attendees were aged between 20 and 34 years (figure 3).

The disposal of a patient can give an indication of the severity of the injuries sustained. Over half of (52%) attendees were discharged, one third (33%) were referred for further treatment and 14% were admitted to hospital (table 3).

¹ Please note that for all tables, all numbers less than five have been suppressed (***) in line with patient confidentiality. If there is only one number less than five in a category then two numbers will be suppressed to prevent back calculation from totals.

Table 4 shows the arrival method of attendees to Stepping Hill ED. Over seven in ten (71%) arrived by car and 19% by ambulance.

Between October 2014 and September 2015 there were 871 assault-related injury attendances to Stepping Hill Hospital ED. The majority (68%) of assault attendees were male and 48% were aged between 20 and 34 years. Over one third (35%) of assault attendees arrived by ambulance (table 5).
