



## Injury attendances to Trafford General Hospital Emergency Department

## April 2013 to March 2014

This report summarises recorded injury attendances to Trafford General Emergency Department (ED) between April 2013 and March 2014.

Between April 2013 and March 2014 there were 51,409 injury attendances to Trafford General ED. Females accounted for just over half (51%) of all injury attendances. The month with the highest injury attendances was July (n=5,357) with December (n=3,118) having the lowest attendances (Figure 1). The majority of attendances were recorded as other injury (93%), Sports injury accounted for 4% of all injury attendances and road traffic collisions (RTC) 2% (Table 1).




Figure 3: Trafford General ED: Total injury attendances by age group and injury group (excluding other injury), April 2013 to March 2014

For all injuries the highest proportion of attendances were for persons aged 20 to 34 (22%) (Figure 2). Over four in ten (41%) RTC attendees were aged 20 to 34 years. Almost half (52%) of sports injury attendees were aged 5 to 19 years (Figure 3).


**Table 2** shows the ethnicity of attendees to Trafford General ED. Almost nine in ten (88%) were White.

The disposal of a patient can give an indication of the severity of the injuries sustained. Over two-fifths (41%) of attendees were discharged, more than a third (37%) were referred and 12% were admitted to hospital (Table 3). Over six in ten (62%) of RTC attendees were discharged. Over half (54%) of sports injury attendees were discharged, while almost three in ten (28%) deliberate self-harm (DSH) attendees were admitted (Table 4).

**Table 5** shows the arrival methods of attendances at Trafford General ED. Most (89%) of attendees arrived by other means, whilst 12% arrived by ambulance.

Table 6 shows assault attendances to Trafford General ED. There were 383 assault attendances recorded between April 2013 and March 2014. More than seven in ten (73%) were male, and over four in ten (45%) were aged 20 to 34 years. Almost a fifth (18%) of assault attendees arrived at the ED by ambulance.

Figure 2: Trafford General ED: Total injury attendances by age group and month, April 2013 to March 2014


