

Monthly Bulletin: April 2010 to March 2011

This bulletin provides a breakdown of all injury attendances at Royal Lancaster Infirmary Emergency Department (ED) between April 2010 and March 2011.

Between April 2010 and March 2011 there were 17,539 injury attendances to Royal Lancaster Infirmary ED. The month with the highest attendance was May with 1,713 attendances (**Figure 1**). There were more male than female attendances presenting at Lancaster Royal Infirmary ED (males=9,905; 56%).

Figure 2 illustrates age group of ED attendances for each month. The majority of ED attendances were aged 15-29 (n=5,299; 30%) and 30-59 years (n=5,103; 29%).

The referral source of injury attendances to the Royal Lancaster Infirmary ED are shown in **Table 1.** Most ED attendances self-referred (58%), 21% had their referral method recorded as other and 16% were referred by the emergency services.

Table 2 details the injury group of ED attendances. For the majority (78%) of attendances, injury group was recorded as other injury. Sports injury accounted for 11% of attendances, 7% were road traffic collisions (RTC) and 3% were assaults.

Table 3 shows the location of incident for injuryattendances; nearly a third (32%) of incidentlocations were recorded as other. This was followed

by incidents in the home (30%) and in a public place (25%).

Table 4 illustrates the discharge destination for patients attending Royal Lancaster Infirmary ED. Six in ten (60%) of attendances were discharged, 14% were referred to the fracture clinic and 10% were admitted to hospital, while almost one in ten (7%) were discharged in to the care of their GP.

Assault attendances


Between April 2010 and March 2011 there were 447 assault attendances to Royal Lancaster Infirmary ED. The month with the highest attendance was June with 49 attendances (**Figure 3**). There were more male than female assault attendances presenting at Royal Lancaster Infirmary ED (males=337; 75%).

Table 5 shows the age groups of assault attendancesfor each month. The majority of ED assaultattendances were aged 15-29 (n=269; 60%) and 31%were 30-59 years old (n=138).

Table 6 illustrates the location of incident for assault attendances to Royal Lancaster Infirmary ED. The primary injury locations for assault attendances were other location (48%), followed by in a public place (32%).

Table 7 shows the discharge destination for assault attendees. Nearly six in ten (57%) of assault attendances were discharged. A fifth (20%) required follow-up treatment, while one in ten (10%) were admitted to hospital.

Figure 1: ED injury attendances by gender and month, April 2010 to March 2011










