

Monthly Bulletin: April 2011 to March 2012

This bulletin provides a breakdown of all injury attendances at Royal Preston Hospital Emergency Department (ED) between April 2011 and March 2012.

Between April 2011 and March 2012 there were 30,680 attendances to Royal Preston Hospital ED. The month with the highest attendances was March with 2,792 (**Figure 1**). There were more male than female attendances presenting at Royal Preston Hospital ED (males=17,096; 56%).




Figure 2: Percentage of ED injury attendances by age group and month, April 2011 to March 2012

Figure 2 illustrates age group of ED attendances for each month. For all injuries the highest proportions of attendances were for persons aged 15-29 (n=8,987; 29%) and 30-59 (n=8,981; 29%) years old.

Table 1 details the injury group of ED attendances. In almost two-fifths (39%) of attendances, injury group was recorded as fall. Other injury accounted for 35% of attendances, sports injury 10%, road traffic collisions (RTC) 10% and assaults 5%.

Table 2 illustrates the location of incident for patients attending the Royal Preston Hospital ED. The primary locations of injury were home (32%) and public place (29%). The discharge destination for injury attendances is displayed in **Table 3**. It indicates that almost half (49%) of attendances were discharged with no follow-up treatment. Nearly a

fifth (17%) of attendances were discharged into the care of their GP and 11% went to the fracture clinic.

Assault attendances




Figure 3: Number of ED assault attendances by gender and month, April 2011 to March 2012

Between April 2011 and March 2012 there were 1,602 assault attendances to Royal Preston Hospital ED. The month with the highest attendance was September with 170 attendances (**Figure 3**). There were more male than female assault attendances presenting at Royal Preston Hospital ED (males=1,195; 75%).

Table 4 details the age group of assault attendances for each month. The majority of ED assault attendances were aged 15-29, (n=935; 58%) and over a third (35%) were aged 30-59 (n=563) years.

Table 5 illustrates the incident location for assault attendances to Royal Preston Hospital ED. The primary incident locations for assault attendances were in a public place (62%), followed by home (14%) and other (9%).

The discharge destination for assault attendances is displayed in **Table 6**. It indicates that nearly half (46%) of assault attendances were discharged with no follow-up treatment. Over a third (34%) of assault attendances required follow-up treatment and 9% were admitted to hospital.


